TEN FOR GIRLS

Millions of girls around the world lack access to feminine hygiene products, and this causes them to miss up to 20% of their education. The problem is especially acute in countries like Kenya, where 4.2 million girls don't have access to sanitary pads.

Ten For Girls provides kits of reusable sanitary pads to needy girls living in Kenyan villages or slums to enable them to stay in school.

Your donation of \$10 will provide a girl with a kit consisting of 8 reusable sanitary pads, a bar of soap, a washcloth, and a pair of underwear in a cotton string bag with the Rotary logo. The pads should last 3 to 5 years, so each girl helped by the program will gain that many years of schooling.

The pads are sewn by a cooperative in Nakuru, Kenya -- the "Najivunia Kuwa Dada" sewing cooperative, a Community Based Organization. "Najivunia Kuwa Dada" means "I am proud to be female." The women in the coop benefit by having meaningful employment that helps girls in their communities.

The coop is supported by the Rotary Club of Nakuru, which identifies the schools where the kits are needed, and the girls who will use them and who will stay in school, and by the Rotary Club of Davis Sunrise.
